Your local government may be entitled to a portion of those research funds, as per Federal Acquisition Regulations ("FAR") by 48 C.F.R. 31.205-18 (see http://edocket.access.gpo.gov/cfr_2007/octqtr/48cfr31.205-18.htm)

Health Resources and Services Administration¹ ("HRSA")

HRSA distributes approximately 90 percent of its funding (\$7 billion in FY 2009) in grants to U.S. States and territories, public and private health care providers, health professions training programs and other organizations.
